But, Easter is more than just a day-long celebration. Easter lasts 50 days, and so the Sundays in the season are named Sundays *of* Easter, rather than Sundays *after*.

For 50 days the church gathers to hear stories of the Risen Christ. For 50 days we gather to be revitalized by remembering the growth and the struggles of the early church. For 50 days we gather to reflect again on the impact this joyous news has on our lives, and on our life together. Such a wideranging task needs a full season of celebration.

During this season of the year, lectionary readings from the Hebrew Scriptures are set aside, and we read instead from the Book of Acts, Luke's account of the beginnings of the church. These may sometimes present an idealized portrait, but the vigor and commitment of

the first Christians is inspiring, and the issues their communities faced are not always different from the challenges facing us today.

The gospel readings at first highlight the appearances of the Risen Christ, and then move to passages from John's gospel intended to help us reflect on the Spirit-filled life of the church. throughout the season, the winds of the Spirit blow hope, passion, and exhilaration through the church then and now.

News from the Garden

Minh Tre, a member of Boy Scout Troop 92 which meets at Sunnyhills UMC, is working on his Eagle Scout project. Trustees has approved his plan, which includes planting additional flowering trees

and installing a watering system along the east side of the lower parking lot.

Minh has spent the winter raising funds and planning the logistics for a major landscaping effort. The new watering system will include the four small cypress bushes along the walkway from the lower parking lot to the sanctuary, the Peace Tree (our Japanese crabapple tree at the corner of the walkway and the parking lot), and the three flowering pears that were planted as a memorial last year. He and his helpers will then continue further along the side of the parking lot, installing permanent waterers for seven new trees.

Assuming supplies are easily available, plans for the new trees call for three crepe myrtles, three silk trees, and one jacaranda. These are all flowering trees which are attractive to hummingbirds, butterflies, and other winged creatures. If all goes well, in a few years we will have a lovely show of flowers throughout the year and enjoy pleasant shade under the trees.

In the meantime, work continues on the Butterfly Garden. The first spring annuals are in, and soon the skippers, cabbage white, buckeyes, painted ladies, and monarchs will be checking out the new blooms. Enjoy the spring show!
