Pastor's Letter

New Year's Celebrations seem to always bring to mind the obligatory New Year's resolutions. I'm not a big fan of New Year's resolutions, perhaps because I'm not very good at keeping "resolutions" that I make on the spur of the moment, or for an "external" reason. I have never kept a resolution to lose weight, stay on an exercise program, or keep up with out-of -own relatives just because that decision was timed with the end or beginning of a calendar year.



But, as much as I am not a fan of quickly-made New Year's resolutions, I try to take the opportunity this time of year to look back over the previous 12 months and take stock of where I've been and how my life has changed. While doing that, I do take note of where I'd like to spend more time and where I'd like to spend less time, but not in the way of a resolution.

A year ago, I commuted to the Soledad UMC every Sunday morning, returning to San Jose on Monday or Tuesday. Gather at the church for coffee, refreshments, and visiting at 10:00 a.m., plus games and activities for youngsters. We'll then carpool to the Tech Museum in San Jose.

IMAX ticket prices are \$9.00 for adults and \$8.00 for seniors. If you want to stay after the show and visit the museum, the combination ticket (admission for both) is \$16 for adults and \$15 for seniors. Please note that SUMC will purchase the theater tickets for all children 12 and under who attend (part of our children's mission).

IMAX Fun Facts

IMAX film is about 10 times the size of a regular film negative. Larger film translates into sharper images on the domed movie screen. The movie is stored on reels the size of tractor tires that must be loaded onto a hand-built projector as big as a Volkswagen Beetle. A typical 40-minute IMAX movie reel requires moving more than three miles of film through the projector. The 15,000-watt xenon lamp used to project the image onto the screen is so bright that, if it were placed on the moon, it could be seen from the Earth.

Meet Christ Across the Border Help Build a New Home in Mexico!

This spring—the week before Easter, to be exact—you have an opportunity to be a part of a life-changing experience. You will work harder than you may think you can. You will get dirtier than you think possible. You will have the opportunity to experience more joy and change lives in ways that can only be described as miraculous.

What is this experience? This is the Mexico mission trip that Pastor Shirley has talked about. In four short days, you and your team will build a home for a family in Mexico. The trip is April 12-19, 2003.

Our Sunnyhills participants will join up with others from Los Altos UMC on Saturday, April 12 in rented and personal vans. We will overnight in a San Diego hotel, worship on Palm Sunday in San Diego, and then cross the border and set up camp that afternoon. Monday, April 14, we will meet our families and begin building our homes. By Thursday our house will be finished and we will be tired! Camp will be struck on Friday morning and that evening will find us back in San Diego, preparing for the drive home to the Bay area on Saturday.



Each of us has gifts that can contribute to this mission. Strong backs are important for mixing cement and the ability to use a measuring tape and saw 2x4s are important for creating walls. There is important work appropriate for children and their grandparents and everyone in between. Most jobs are learned as we go, and willingness is the most important tool of the trip.

If you are unable to accompany us on the mission trip, your support is still important. Before the trip, we will prepare welcoming baskets for the homeowners, collect tools, and borrow camping equipment that we need for the building effort. During the trip, prayer from those at home is powerful assistance. Think about how you might support this mission.



Registration information is available in the Sanctuary and the church office. Or call the office and we'll put it in the mail to you. Sunnyhills UMC will underwrite a portion of each participant's fees, so don't let the cost of the trip keep you from attending. If you feel called to this mission, talk to Pastor Shirley—a way will be found for you to go! Registrations are due to Pastor Shirley early in January, so time is short. Pray. Discuss this opportunity with your family. Join us. Your life will never be the same!
