Jerry and Netha Thacker Early Wedding In New SUMC Sanctuary

April 6, 2003

Dear Irene,

How lovely to hear from you. I have wonderful memories of the Sunnyhills Methodist Church—from meeting for services in the Union Hall to getting married in the “new” sanctuary. I think the sanctuary was still pretty new when I got married there in November 1964. I wonder if mine was the first wedding in that building. I remember that Rev. Hicks was very nervous—his hands were shaking as he held the book to read the service.

The church family made Sunnyhills Church such a special place. I think most of the church members were at my wedding. I remember that the church women decorated the church for the ceremony and provided coffee and punch for the reception that followed—in the same room.

I don’t know if I have much that will help the project, although I think the church and community is worthy of commemoration. I’m enclosing copies of some photos from my wedding (November 21, 1964) and one from my sister’s wedding, also at Sunnyhills, three years later (November 8, 1967).

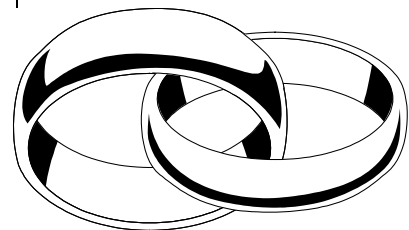

In today's economy, many of our sister churches are unable to fund 100% of their share; as a consequence, the Conference is recasting budgets to reflect expected income.

Each of you can be proud and thankful for our current financial standing. Sunnyhills has come a long way from its financial crisis of several years ago. As a small church, though, things can change rapidly. Right now, our financial outlook is slightly behind projections. Summer can be a disjointed time in the life of the congregation and the church. Predictably, families take the opportunities to get away, to relax and take it easy, to take family vacations, travel, and camp. Of course, this means our Sunday morning attendance drops and our giving goes down as well. As you travel this summer, remember your church and its financial obligations. Let's keep our giving stable and strong through the summer.

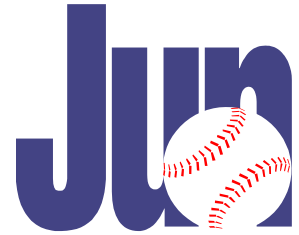

California-Nevada Annual Conference Meets in June

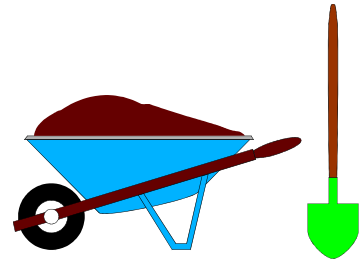


Guy Haas, Sunnyhills UMC's Lay Member, and Pastor Shirley, Clergy Member, will attend the California-Nevada Annual Conference Session on June 18-22 in Sacramento. This annual meeting carries out the business of the Conference (United Methodist churches in northern California and most of Nevada). This year we also elect delegates to General Conference, our international governing body, which will be held in 2004.

Recommendations and issues to come before the Conference are posted on the Conference Website, www.cnumc.org/2003con.htm Questions about budget, finance, pastoral appointments, establishing new congregations, disposition of church property, ministry in all its myriad forms, and positions on social justice issues are a few of the delegates' responsibilities. Issues this year include a comprehensive study on Asian-American Clergy and Ministry, moving the episcopal residence, and reorganizing camping/retreat ministries. Talk with Pastor Shirley or Guy if you have questions or would like more information about the workings of Annual Conference.

Please keep Guy and Shirley and the entire conference in your prayers as they seek to discern God's will amidst the proposals, rhetoric, arguments, finance reports, and many, many meetings.

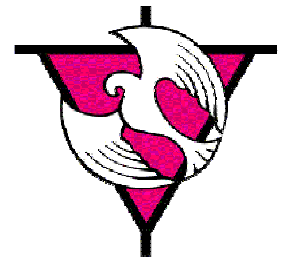

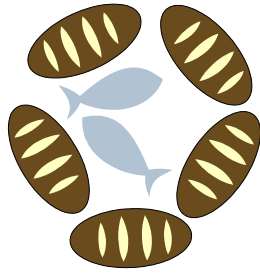

Calling All Kids! Summer Sunday School Classes

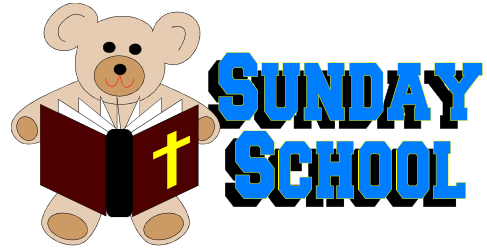
