## SUMC Work Project

### Volunteers in Mission

*March 10-13, 2004*

Roll out the red carpet and polish up those welcoming smiles—the San Jose District chapter of VIM (volunteers in mission) arrives at Sunnyhills UMC in March. This group of (mostly) retired folks heads out to lend a hand when local UMC congregations need help with property maintenance and repairs.



Number one priority is painting the outside of the church buildings. Light cream walls and mallard green trim will really spruce up our presence on the street! Extending the sidewalk between Jones Hall and the Butterfly Garden will get rid of soggy mud when it rains and give people more room to move around at large events. Another project is a new shed to shelter yard and maintenance equipment and free up badly-needed storage space for other purposes. Interior painting plans include the pastor's and front offices, which are looking sadly drab. Window frames in Jones Hall and the upper building need to be scraped down and refinished. Two trees need to come down. There are still some potholes in the upper parking lot to be filled. And, another idea—well, let's just say that we have plenty of items for all the willing hands we can muster!

The caravaners are hard at work getting ready. Notices have gone out to churches and volunteers. An article has been published in the District Newsletter. At least three RVs are planning to camp over in our upper lot. Volunteers from up and down the district are signing up. A design is ready for the shed. The cement job is calculated. Pruning saws and clean rags are laid out ready to go, and the paint sprayer has been cleaned.

## Pastor's Letter

Lent is upon us, the 40 days plus Sundays before Easter. If you were to look in a Bible dictionary, you wouldn't find an entry for Lent, because it isn't a Biblical season. The observance of a penitential preparation for Easter began in the early Church long before it was called Lent. The word itself is the Anglo-Saxon word for spring. Some time in the very early church, the custom arose to fast for 40 days (or perhaps 40 hours—there is some controversy over this), in imitation of Christ's fasting in the wilderness, as a spiritual preparation for the feast of Easter. Over the first centuries of the early church, the practice of Lent settled into a time of fasting and penance; sometimes more severe, sometimes less, whose nature varied from one area and one period to another. Often those getting ready for baptism and confirmation used this time for special preparation for those sacraments and rites.



In the contemporary Protestant church, we've pretty much turned away from the fasting and penance traditions of Lent. You may have friends who give up something for Lent, or perhaps this is a custom that you observe. In the past, I never quite made sense of giving something up for Lent: Somehow I couldn't make the connection between denying myself chocolate, or soda, or coffee, and having a better relationship with God. It always seemed so . . . well . . . so artificial.

This year in my reading, however, I came across an article by Barbara Brown Taylor<sup>1</sup>, an author and preacher whose work I admire. She puts the idea of giving up something for Lent in a light that does make sense to me: that simply giving up a favorite thing is only the beginning. The real work begins when our mind goes to that thing we have given up. We go there and find an empty place. We reach for the coffee, the candy bar, the TV remote, even as we remember that we've given it up. For a split second we panic: what now? What will fill that hole? We can—as we have done so many times—fill that hole with another “thing”: We've given up candy, but not an apple. We've given up TV, but not reading. We've given up coffee, but not water. OR, we can simply sit with that empty place and realize that maybe—just maybe—that place belongs to God. And we can give that place to God. God will be with us in our silence, sit with us in our emptiness, and listen to the needs and desires of our souls.

I invite you to sit with God during this Lenten season. I'm giving up chocolate: I think I get it now.






## Let the Sanctuary Bloom Flowers for Easter Sunday
