Sunday—January 30th—11:30 a.m. District Superintendent Nymphas Edwards, Presiding

The last Sunday in January marks an important date in the life of our church and also in the life our pastor as she moves toward full ordination in the larger United Methodist Church. Please plan to attend!



The morning begins with worship at 9:30 a.m. San Jose District Superintendent Nymphas Edwards will be among our guests and we will also be videotaping the service for Pastor Shirley. The UMC ordination process includes several years of meetings, examinations, and interviews overseen by the Board of Ordained Ministry. Candidates this year will submit a sermon videotape as part of their presentation. This is the third year of candidacy for Pastor Shirley and we hope the subcommittee will be recommending her for ordination as an elder later this year.

After the celebration of worship, our District Superintendent will meet briefly with our Staff-Parish Relations committee while the congregation enjoys fellowship and a light luncheon in Jones Hall. The Charge Conference will start at about 11:30 a.m., presided over by the D.S. This important business meeting includes setting pastoral compensation and electing church officers for 2005. We will also review our accomplishments in 2004 and our hopes for 2005.

Pastor's Letter

I don't know about you, but the New Year didn't pad in on little soft feet this year. It appeared at my front door full grown without anything I could do about it. No easing into 2005 in my household—just <u>thunk</u>, and here we are. That brief moment of repose—a day or so—I often feel between the wonder of Christmas and resuming the regular (and busy!) schedule of the rest of the year was swallowed up as we followed world news of



the tsunami and its after-effects, with significant changes in the lives of several congregation members, and on a personal level an upper respiratory infection that just won't go away, and the realization that my daughter, Rebecca, turns 18 on January 17th.

Looking back over the past couple of weeks, I am coming to believe that the "brief moment of repose" I thought I've had in past years is probably a figment of my memory's imagination. No matter what time of year, each day holds ups and downs, joys and concerns, opportunities for engagement and opportunities for withdrawal. Every day holds the opportunity for a brief moment of repose. For me, that brief moment is a time to refocus on priorities, to re-center myself, and yes, to pray. If I wait for the calendar to tell me when I can take time for that experience, I am missing everyday opportunities.

So, for this new year that has *thunked* into my life, I'm resolving to take the opportunity to use these brief moments as they come my way—to focus, center, and spend time with God. I'll take a day when I can, but I won't wait for the calendar. I invite you to join me in using the brief moments in your life as a time to connect with God, too.




Santa Maria Virgen, the Episcopal






Feeding the Hungry In Our Community 363 Fund

Changing Lives One House at a Time Mexico Mission 2005

This spring, April 16-23, 2005, participants from Sunnyhills will again join the Los Altos UMC building teams on a mission to Mexico. You will work harder than you may think you possibly can. You will get dirtier than you think possible. You will have the opportunity to experience more joy and change lives in ways that can only be described as miraculous. In four short days, you and your team build a home for a family in Mexico.

Each of us has gifts that can contribute to this mission. Strong backs are important for mixing cement and the ability to use a measuring tape and saw 2x4s are important for creating walls. The abilities to laugh, and get to know people, to build community and encourage others are just as critical for the team. There is important work appropriate for children and their grandparents and everyone in between. Construction skills are learned as we go, and willingness is the most important tool of the trip.

If you are unable to accompany us on the mission trip, your support is still important. Before the trip, we may be collecting items for welcoming baskets for the homeowners, and will take a monetary offering to help defray the expenses of the mission. During the trip, prayer from those at home is powerful support. Think about how you might support this mission.

Because Sunnyhills underwrites a portion of each participant's fees, the cost for adults is \$400, for children under 10 is \$250, which includes our hotel stays in San Diego. Don't let money stand in your way: if you feel called to this mission, talk to Pastor Shirley—a way will be found for you to go! Your registration and a deposit of \$200 per person is due to the church office before January 30th to reserve your spot on this life-changing experience.
