Ever wonder what happens during that week in June when Pastor Shirley and our lay member to Annual Conference (this quadrennium: Guy Haas; alternate, Cathy Deppe) go to Annual Conference? Annual Conference is a gathering of clergy and lay members, called together to deal with the "business" of the Conference, and to worship and celebrate the ministries of the Conference. Our Conference encompasses the geographic area of Northern California and Nevada; almost 400 churches, and more than 90,000 professing members.

This year, Annual Conference Session will be held in Sacramento, June 14 – 18. To get more information on what happens at Conference, visit the website: http://www.cnumc.org/acs/acs2005/. During Annual Conference Session, the Daily Connection is posted to the website and reports the highlights of each day.

#### Flood Buckets

Each year at Annual Conference, a mission collection is taken. Not just money, but things we can collect that will be used in the mission of the UMC around the globe. Every year, the Annual conference collects used eyeglasses, hearing aids and old cell phones.

This year every church is also being urged to bring at least one Flood Bucket to the conference. Flood Buckets are a valuable way the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) helps people around the country and around the world deal with the overwhelming job of cleaning up after a disaster.

#### Each Flood Bucket will contain:

One clean, sealable 5-gallon bucket with the following items packed inside:

Bleach (two 1-quart or one 82 oz. bottle

5 scouring pads

7 or 8-pack Sponges

1 scrub brush

18 cleaning towels (reusable wipes)

Liquid laundry detergent (two 25 oz. or

one 50 oz. bottle)

1 household cleaner, 12-16 oz. bottle

Disinfectant dish soap, 16-28 oz. bottle

48 clothes pins

Clothes line (two 50 ft. or one 100 ft.)

5 dust masks

2 pair latex gloves

1 pair work gloves

24-bag roll of heavy-duty trash bags, 33-45 gallon (remove roll from box

1 Insect repellant spray, 6-14 oz. can (If aerosol, cans must have protective

We'll put all items in the plastic bucket and seal the lid.

Pick an item or two from the list above, and bring to the church office, or to worship on or before June 12. Pastor Shirley and Guy Haas will take our Flood bucket(s) to Conference.

We will collect an offering for Conference Missions on June 12.


## Celebration in Spirit and Gay Pride Festival 2005
