Dear Friends,

Last Sunday after the social hour we had WRAP, monthly administrative meeting. The meeting went longer than usual because of a special item on the agenda: Planning for the 50th anniversary of Sunnyhills UMC, which is expected to take place sometime in October next year. At the meeting I was assigned a task: To help the congregation decide on a theme for the celebration. I believe making conscious efforts in choosing a theme right for the occasion is important because it is in turn inseparably connected to envisioning the future of Sunnyhills UMC. I have given some thoughts on my task and I want to share them with you.

It has been three months since my new appointment at Sunnyhills began. During this time, I have come across various self-descriptions of the congregation; and two of them stood out most. One, Sunnyhills UMC was the first integrated Methodist church west of Mississippi; and in my opinion, the founding members' commitment to integration was reaffirmed when Sunnyhills voted to become a reconciling congregation in the 1990's. The other self-description was: Both the congregation and its community have become diverse. This progression occurred as new immigrants moved into the community.

I believe these self-descriptions offer valuable insights in choosing a theme for the anniversary. And, on the basis of these self-descriptions I have come up with a question that can help in choosing an appropriate theme. That is: How will Sunnyhills UMC reaffirm its commitment to integration in a new situation where the congregation and its community have become increasingly diverse?

The idea of celebrating the 50th anniversary is quite exciting for me. What we are trying to do as a congregation is an attempt to create something larger than our selves. I wonder what our individual life is after all? While we are alive we occupy certain amount of space. However, we know that there will come a time when we cease to occupy that very space. But we also understand that what we have created will continue to occupy its space beyond our individual life-- of course, by this I mean not just physical space. We are, in fact, attempting to create a spiritual space that will exist beyond our individual life.

I will share more of my thoughts in the coming months as our planning develops further. In the mean time, let us take some time and try to answer the question I proposed above. And I am very much interested in hearing what you have to say in this regard.

Gardens must be located in Santa Clara or San Mateo counties, and contain 30 percent or more California native plants.

The link above also has notifications of native plant sales and plant exchanges. This may be an excellent way of getting free and low cost cuttings. As the plants take little water, the long term cost should be small... just labor to keep them looking nice.

We have finished all but 1 post out of 13, and replaced almost all of the diseased fascia boards. We still have to replace some tongue & groove boards, paint the fascia, touch up the posts and go up on top of the roof to replace the drainage with larger drop outlets. I think this will be key to keeping the water from collecting on the roof.

We will have a trustees meeting next Saturday, September 30th, after the work party is over to assess what is left to do.
