Seen in the book of nature grand, taught by His love on every hand.

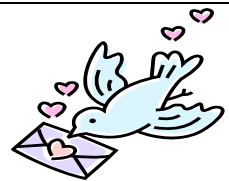
Let us be thankful in our hearts, thankful for all the truth imparts,

A Forgotten Dream

Korean Ethnic Language Ministry at Sunnyhills is going to have its first gathering on November 4 in the afternoon. It is a component of a larger growth plan for Sunnyhills under the concept of “ethnic language ministry.” Growth of Asian immigrant population both in Milpitas and its neighboring cities has provided new opportunities for congregational growth. Among the Filipinos and Koreans is particularly the case. Earlier this spring, under the leadership of Pastor Sazon, Filipino Ethnic Language Ministry got started, and now another Ethnic Language Ministry in Korean is set to start.

Starting a ministry in Korean has a special meaning for me. I feel as if I am beginning to remember a forgotten dream. I came to the United States in 1974 and I received my deacon’s order in 1983, which coincided with my graduation from a seminary on the East coast. This past summer I was going through my old papers and came across copies of my essays that I had submitted as part of my application for ordination and also for seminary admission. And, one of the reasons for entering the ministry, as they were expressed in the essays, was both my interest and concern for the Korean immigrants—in 1970’s there were less than a half dozen Korean immigrant churches in the greater New York area where I and my family arrived as immigrants; now, by contrast, in the Bay Area alone there are more than one hundred Korean churches. In other words, Korean immigrant churches have grown dramatically all over the United States.

When I wrote those essays I never imagined that I would be in a situation which I am now at Sunnyhills. Now I feel my forgotten dream has evolved into a vision; and I realize this vision is larger than the dream I once had because our community has become racially, ethnically, and culturally more diverse than ever before. And I am firmly convinced that diversity is a source of strength rather than weakness. For practical reason, for instance, I expect that Ethnic Language Ministries will provide immediate congregational growth at Sunnyhills; and in turn, in the mean time, it will make time for the existing ministry in English to grow as well.

How successful our Ethnic Language Ministry will be is unknown, but what I believe is, we do what we can at a given situation utilizing what we have at hand. And, let us pray and hope that Ethnic Language Ministry will provide a new momentum for the ministry at Sunnyhills.

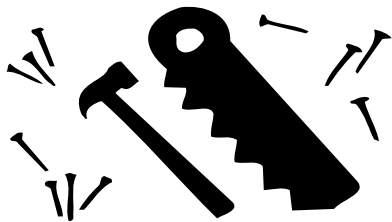

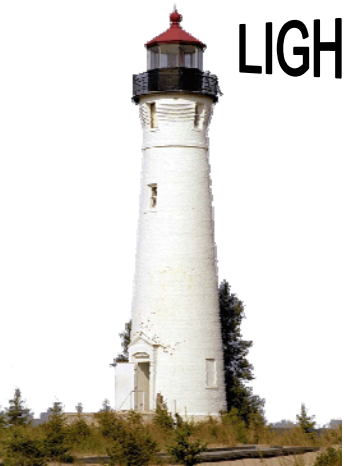
