Dear Members and Friends,

### Where Our Confidence Stems From?

I wrote my previous letter at the beginning of Lent hoping that with the celebration of Easter this year ministry at Sunnyhills would move forward with more confidence than before. And as I was preparing for the Easter celebration, I became convinced that such confidence comes from our relationship with Jesus whom we believe as Christ.

**Christ** is the [English](#) term for the [Greek](#) *khristos* meaning "the [anointed](#)". In the ([Greek](#)) [Septuagint](#) version of the [Old Testament](#), *khristos* was used to translate the [Hebrew](#) *Mašiah*, ([messiah](#)), meaning "(one who is) anointed." And, Christians believe that Jesus of Nazareth, the Christ, was the son of God.

How do you experience this Jesus whom you have never met in person, but only known in the stories of the gospels? For me, I experience above all gratitude when I think of Jesus. In other words, more than anything else I want to thank him first and that is how I relate with Jesus. And particularly I feel this way when I bring to my mind Jesus who was crucified.

The crucifixion was a means of execution as well as a symbol of power used by the Romans to deter anyone who would challenge their authority. And, the religious establishment of Judaism at the time conspired with the Romans to frame and murder Jesus, whom the people received as a rabbi and a prophet; for Jesus took away the authority and power of the Temple, the ultimate symbol for the ancient Judaism at the time.

But for Christians, the cross now had a different meaning. They now see that Jesus' life, expressed in his words and deeds, was an embodiment of some power which was entirely different in kind and much stronger than the combined power of the Rome and the Temple. Furthermore, for Christians, that power of Jesus is also active and available for us even today in the world. Now as result, Jesus opened a new life for us, empowered and led by the Holy Spirit, which is for all who are willing.

Thus, the resurrection signifies a new life, the birth of a people, Christians, whom I also want to call "the Easter People." They used to be those disciples who "followed" Jesus without knowing what he was up to. But after the crucifixion, and more precisely because of the crucifixion, they began to understand Jesus. And they began to understand that they were more than "followers" since the risen Christ was walking with them. Then, Christian life, or ministry of the church, was born out of this gratitude toward Jesus. I believe when we let this gratitude inform and guide our ministry, we can move forward with confidence.

Beloved church member and dear friend Julia Jones, died Sunday morning, March 23, 2008 after a brief illness. Julia had been a member of the Milpitas community since 1959. The Joneses moved here to be closer to their place of employment, the Ford Motor Co. Assembly Plant, which relocated from Richmond.

Julia and her husband settled in a house in our Sunnyhills subdivision on Valmy Street and had remained here for nearly 50 years. She became a nurse and was employed at Agnews for 24 of those years, retiring in 1985. Julia was a longtime member of Sunnyhills United Methodist church and was active in social clubs such as MilJose, and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People.

A memorial service will be held at the Lima Family Cedar Lawn Mortuary, 48800 Warm Springs Blvd., Fremont and will begin at 1 p.m. on April 1.

The Sunnyhills Neighborhood Association, in conjunction with the Sunnyhills United Methodist Church is offering a unique way to honor Earth Day this year! Join us on Sunday, **April 20th** from 2-4pm in Jones Hall (355 Dixon Road, Milpitas, CA 95035) for a presentation on the costs and benefits of installing solar power for your home. Kurt Newick, founder and chairman of the Global Warming and Energy Committee for the Loma Prieta Chapter of the Sierra Club will be our presenter. Kurt will help you understand both the technology available and the economics involved in converting to solar energy. Kurt will also provide information on group discounts - get together with your neighbors to bundle your projects!

Kurt led the effort to survey all permitting jurisdictions in the greater Bay Area and published a Solar Permit Fee study, resulting in the reduction or elimination of solar permit fees throughout the San Francisco Bay Area. Kurt has participated on the Silicon Valley SolarTech team and has volunteered with NorCal Solar Home Tour. He lives in a solar electric home in Campbell, with self-installed solar radiant heat and solar hot water systems. Kurt Newick has a B.S. degree in Computer Science from Chico State University. He is a life long Santa Clara County resident, and an active participant in many environmental issues.

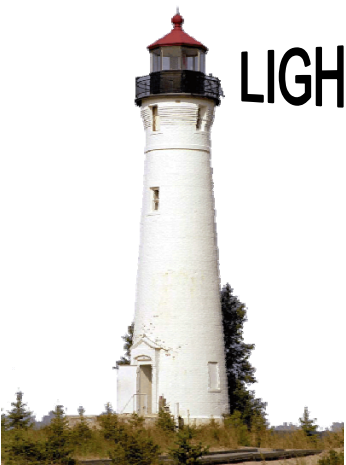
