

Dear Friends,

We are living with a sense of crisis because of the current economic downturn. The new Obama administration has been implementing economic stimulus plans to revive the ailing economy. While I was reading Paul's letter to the Christians in Ephesus, I felt I discovered an answer when it comes to finding a solution in a crisis situation. Of course, I am not here saying that I have found in the Bible an answer for an economic problem. But, I understood something that may have important implications in a crisis situation of groups in general, including a local church, for instance. And, that is, enabling the members of a group to have a sense of common purpose is a must for a group to come to terms with a crisis situation successfully. Let me quote Ephessians 2:1-10.

¹In the past you were dead because you sinned and fought against God. ²You followed the ways of this world and obeyed the devil. He rules the world, and his spirit has power over everyone who doesn't obey God. . . ⁴⁻⁵But God was merciful! We were dead because of our sins, but God loved us so much that he made us alive with Christ, and God's wonderful kindness is what saves you. ⁶God raised us from death to life with Christ Jesus, and he has given us a place beside Christ in heaven. . . . ¹⁰God planned for us to do good things and to live as he has always wanted us to live. That's why he sent Christ to make us what we are.

Paul explains the differences between the life with and without having faith in Christ. And then in verse 10, Paul explains the final purpose of this new life of having faith in Christ. At the end of the day, if I use a common expression, God calls Christians for a single purpose "to do good things" which is how "he has always wanted us to live." Obviously the "good things" are something that the current powers, disobedient to God, are refusing to do and do otherwise.(verse 2)

Churches are in crisis; they have lost their vitality. This is not something new to hear; for mainline protestant demoninations have been steadily losing their membership. Our own annual conference is also addressing this issue of revitilizing the church. How can the church regain its vitality? My answer to this question is: we need to regain the sense of purpose as a church.

We will be celebrating the resurrection of Christ soon on Easter Sunday. And, I sinerely hope that this year's Easter will be an occasion to regain the sense of purpose as a church. So that we will carry out our ministry at Sunnyhills with a sense of unity working together for a shared vision for our future. This will be the experience of resurrection of Christ, who is the head of the church. And, I hope we will be able to answer for ourselves the question: "What are the good things to do so that we live as God has always wanted us to live?"



Leadership Training at Sunnyhills

Sunnyhills' lay leaders gathered on Saturday, March 21 for a day long leadership training. At the start of the day, Pastor Chansoo Lee led us in a reflection of scripture and a reading from <u>Vital Congregations</u> which focused us on thinking about renewing our congregation. Erik Larsen, our Lay Leader, then laid out a statement of purpose for our church. We quickly came to an agreement that Sunnyhills is a reconciling multicultural congregation united to share the love of God.

We discussed many of our existing ministries, programs, and activities. These included special worship services, Korean and English language worship services, Annual Conference, BBQs and potlucks, hymn fests, choir, centering prayer, lunch bunch, visiting the sick and infirm, butterfly garden, and adult bible study. We host organizations such as Sunnyhills Neighborhood Association, NA, AA, and Al-Anon. We rent our facility out to several organizations.

Also, we discussed five new initiatives for our church. The new projects include the following:

- 1. Additional lay leadership training
- 2. Establish a Finance and Stewardship Committee to proactively address a projected drop in giving during the Summer months. The first meeting of the committee will be April 6, 6:30 PM.
- 3. Convene a Youth Program Committee to develop a proposal for an extended summer Vacation Bible School.
- 4. Develop a proposal to revamp the Sunnyhills Monthly Breakfasts
- 5. Develop a proposal for creating a vegetable garden injunction with a new Health and Wellness ministry.

In the coming weeks, Pastor Chon Su Lee will be working with lay leaders to develop many of these proposals and bring them before our administrative body of WRAP for consideration and a vote.

After a wonderful lunch provided by Gwen Freeman, we participated in a discussion about leadership in a multicultural church. The conversation was led by Edna Cruz from St. Paul United Methodist Church in Fremont. We answered several questions including: Why is multicultural ministry necessary? What are requirements for successful multicultural ministry? And what are the obstacles that the congregation has to overcome? We learned that a multi-cultural church is one that is multi-ethnic in composition, and where cultural values are respected, recognized and embraced.

In conclusion, the time we spent together was very worthwhile. This will help us lay the ground work for a very productive year of ministry where we move together united in mission and vision for a re-vitalized congregation.
