Dear Friends,

Summer vacation is almost over and a new school year will start next week. I have three daughters and the second one is starting college this September. I am glad that she has got into the school of her choice. I wish not only for my own daughter, but for all the best for those beginning college and I hope they will do well.

But, I also have concerns. The other day, I heard a broadcast on the radio regarding the current national debt after the federal bail out plan for the banks. It is something equivalent to each person in the United States owing about \$42,000. My daughter owes that much already. She is not getting a monthly statement for this. But she will be paying through various taxes she will have to pay.

Such concern is not just for those who will be starting college this fall. I also have the same kind of concern for others like my eldest daughter who will be graduating from college next May. Job prospects are not encouraging for the graduating college students. Unemployment in California is, for instance, 12%. So they will be entering a job market that has already been experiencing a high unemployment rate.

You may wonder why I am speaking about the current economy. Because of the current economic situation, I learned a lot about how our economy works. Of course, I can say I know “something” about the Bible as a pastor. But I did not know I also needed to understand how the economy works, for instance, if I want to understand better what the Bible says. This also applies to understanding how politics works.

I do not want to remain a passive consumer of discouraging news about our current economy. I want to be active and proactive. I feel I need to do something so that I can see myself not powerless. One thing I want to suggest in this regard to our congregation is the attendance and participation in the Community Breakfast. I expect it to be a place where average citizens like me will get informed and educated about various community issues that affect us everyday. If you feel Wall Street, Washington D.C., and Sacramento are too far away, then at least you should not feel the same with Milpitas City Hall and our own neighborhood.

8 a.m. on September 12, which is Saturday, will be the first Community Breakfast. I invite all to this breakfast. Come enjoy the breakfast and learn the history of the Community Breakfast. I also encourage you to share your ideas about its future.
