Dear Friends,

Last Monday morning when I came to the church I saw a homeless person next to one of the sheds that we use for outdoor storage. This person must have stayed on the church property the night before and was getting out of her sleeping bag. And this was the first time I have encountered a homeless person on the church campus since I came to Sunnyhills four years ago.

I understand this is indicative of the worsening economy and harder times ahead. But at the same time, this forced me to re-examine what is really involved in expressing the purpose of our ministry in a mission statement.

Our congregation is currently working on a mission statement for our church and we are going to adapt a finalized version of it at the church conference in November. For now, it says:

We strive to build a faith community welcoming to all as we journey together with Christ for the transformation of world.

When I saw this homeless person on the church campus, I did not know how to react. And the first thought was "What if this person does not leave voluntarily?" I knew I was not ready to ask this person to leave. She must have felt safe on our church campus last night. I was not going to open our church building for this person either. I was forced to admit that I was not ready to come to terms with the situation. I acted as if I did not see this person and walked into my office. Apparently she left later.

This "small incident" said a lot to me. If we want to transform our world, we need to transform ourselves first. As I saw for myself, I was such a person who was incapable of making an ethnical decision in the presence of this homeless person. That is to say, I got so used to myself that I stopped questioning myself and failed to see who I was.

But I know I want to prepare myself for next time when I encounter a homeless person on the church campus. For that, I must answer the following questions. What do I mean by "striving to build a faith community welcoming all"? Whom am I going to include in this "all"? And what do I mean by "welcoming"?
