## "We are striving to build a community of faith welcoming to all as we journey together with Christ for the transformation of world."

Last Saturday I was at the church and there were two events going on the church campus. One, medical workers from Stanford Blood Center were conducting a blood drive in the sanctuary. Two, the Sunnyhills Neighborhood Association was having a food drive in the church parking lot. The food collected would be donated to the Milpitas Food Pantry. I forgot about the food drive, but I donated my blood. I learned that with one pint of blood donated at least three persons can be helped. Also, I learned that it takes about 8 weeks for my body to replenish the blood that I lost and I am allowed to give again. With this new knowledge I decided to donate on a regular basis, like twice a year at least. I felt good knowing that my blood would be used to help someone in need.

Here is something else I learned over this weekend. October 24 was the Internal Day of Climate Action and "people in 181 countries came together for the most widespread day of environmental action in the planet's history." Also, I learned the following fact while reading an article about the global warming—go to 350.org for the article. Scientists say 350 parts per million is the safe limit for carbon dioxide concentration in the atmosphere. If it reaches beyhond this limit and remains so the planet faces both human and natural disasters as result of climate changes. Currently, 387 parts per million is the level of CO2 concentration. "Everyone from Al Gore to the U.N.'s top climate scientist has now embraced this goal as necessary for stabilizing the planet and preventing complete disaster."

On last Sunday morning we had the worship service. During the service, we shared joys and concerns in our personal lives as well as in our community; and we prayed about them. After the service, we had the regular administrative meeting where we prepared for the church conference scheduled for next Sunday; also we worked on our mission statement that we would adapt at the church conference, namely "We strive to build a community of faith, welcoming to all, as we journey together with Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world." And Micah 6:8 is the scripture that goes with the statement: He (the Lord) has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

Having a mission statement serves various purposes. One of them I realized over this weekend is to connect together what I do everyday in such a way that I experience life something more meaningful and important as a whole. I donate blood; I know the global warming is a serious problem; I preach; I conduct meeting, for instances. If someone ask me why I do these things? The mission statement is my answer. I say so because I believe in the values expressed in Micah 6:8, namely justice, compassion, and humility before God and all God's creation.
