Something to Do for Lent

At the 2009 annual conference in June, the formation of circuits was decided. Within a district, churches within ten miles radius come together to form a circuit. Our church belongs to a circuit with seven other United Methodist churches. Since September 2009, the pastors from the circuit member churches have met almost once every month.

The circuit meeting usually begins at 10 a.m. and ends by 1 p.m. with having lunch together. During the meeting, we share joys and concerns relating to families and congregations; and we pray for one another. Also, we discuss different topics and issues and share our views on ministries. So basically through circuit meetings we give mutual support and learn from one another. For instance, at the last meeting which Sunnyhills hosted, I was asked to present what our congregation is doing in terms of mission. After my presentation there was time for questions and answers. Sifa is the pastor at Genesis UMC and his comment during the discussion kind of stuck in my mind. He is a mover and his leadership is doing things. I find myself at the opposite end; I tend to think, perhaps think too much and end up being unable to do what I thought I would. I clearly understood where Sifa was coming from and I agree with him.

If we understand Jesus as a reformer, his teachings and work were rooted in the prophetic tradition of the Old Testament. It was there already before the time of Jesus. In other words, it was not Jesus alone who adapted this tradition, and there were others too. But it was Jesus who "did it." He carried out his work being informed by the tradition with clear sense of purpose and commitment.

Congregational growth is a major concern for almost every church I know, including our own church. I have tried to understand how our church got to where we are now by analyzing the social history of the congregation. I believe I have a good grasp in this regard. But this is perhaps only half of the answer. Understanding alone cannot provide power to change, move, and grow.

Our mission is "to build a community of faith welcoming to all, as we journey together with Jesus for the transformation of the world." And I have explained that transformation of the world begins with the transformation of self. And now how about seeing us as a reformer? In other words, what we need to accomplish our mission is already there for us. The requirement is just to do what we already know, our tradition, which is the tradition of discipleship.

Mission gives a sense of purpose and help us set specific objectives. And discipleship is a means to achieve our mission; for it is a requirement. And the discipleship essentially involves raising the level of our commitment.* At the same time we should not be preoccupied with the performance of our work, rather concentrate on engagement.** I say, church growth is not a goal, but an outcome of discipleship.

Concerning discipleship, I want to suggest the following for this Lent. As you read the gospel, try to answer what enabled Jesus to keep his sense of purpose and maintain his commitment? And, what prevented his disciples from keeping their sense of purpose and maintaining their commitment? Where the disciples fell away from Jesus and why?






