Dear Friends,

The planning commission met last night at the Milpitas City Hall. It was a long meeting; which started at 7 p.m. and went on well past midnight. It was an interesting experience; I not only sat through the entire meeting, but I also spoke to the commission representing our congregation's view on the Walmart expansion plan which was on the agenda. Walmart wants to turn its existing store into a 24 hour Super Store by adding grocery to its general merchandise section. Earlier this year our congregation voted to oppose the expansion plan.

I was speaking to the conscience of commissioners, letting them know the values that ought to inform their decision were compassion, justice, and truth. And I pointed out that though the commission was reviewing the environmental impact report of the expansion plan, the heart of the matter can be expressed in terms of: The interest of a corporation vs. that of local businesses, dividends vs. wages, greed vs. common good, luxury vs. subsistence. To be honest with you, I was a bit nervous and ended up not covering all that I had prepared. But one of the commissioners got the message though he disagreed. In his concluding remark, commissioner Tierman explained that value of freedom (of choice) was more important to him than compassion, justice, and truth; and he voted for the expansion plan.

Though my speech was short, now that I look back, it was a preaching in fact. I appeared before the commission wearing my collar representing a faith community who believes in God who is compassionate, just, and truthful. I introduced myself as the pastor serving a Methodist church founded by the auto workers fifty years ago in the City of Milpitas. I felt the conviction and I made known what I believed and whom I was representing.

I can explain why I spoke with such conviction. I was facing a concrete reality created by a powerful corporation; I was not speaking in a situation created in imagination. Rather it was a situation that would affect the welfare of the workers who may lose their jobs as the result of the expansion. And these commissioners were in the position of power and how they would vote had a direct impact on these workers of the existing groceries.

After my speech, an attorney walked up to me and introduced himself. He was a legal counsel for a local union. He thought it was quite interesting that our congregation voted to oppose the expansion plan. In fact, we were the only church and a religious organization from Milpitas that appeared before the commission.

Three other church members were at the meeting. Daislyn Pease and Guy Haas spoke also as citizens of Milpitas to reject the plan; Erik Larsen was on the commission as an alternate. Despite our efforts and other concerned citizens and workers, the commission approved the plan last night by recommending the environmental impact study of the plan. But I felt a sense of unity as we were engaged in a ministry with a common purpose. And, I felt we were engaged in a spiritual struggle. What we were facing was invisible and yet real and powerful. Our struggle was over values and gaining the heart of these commissioners. More than ever, I am convinced that advocating the interests of workers and protecting the welfare of our community is an important component of our ministry. And it is concrete way of remaining faithful to our tradition and history as a local congregation and our faith.
