His cross stands empty to the sky. Let streets and homes with praises ring.


His love in death shall never die.

Dear Friends,

We're well into Lent, the 40 day (not including Sunday) time before Easter for meditation and reflection. Frankly, I find that there is *way* too much to meditate and reflect upon!

The earthquake in New Zealand had barely run its news cycle when Japan's earthquake, tsunami and nuclear tragedies have taken their place in the forefront. Across this country, it feels as though many states are retreating to places we know existed from history: overturning collective bargaining laws, attacking women's rights on several fronts, and balancing tax cuts for the very rich on the backs of public education and the less advantaged.

I used a prayer last Sunday that reminded us: "God, you are a God of minimum protection, but also a God of maximum support." That pretty much sums up much of my theology: We are the hands and feet of God in this world. If we take seriously our mission to be those hands and feet, then we not only stand in solidarity with the people of Japan and the Pacific Rim, but we also send funds that can be used for relief and rebuilding efforts. If we take our role seriously as citizens of this state and country, then our voices – through letters and calls to our lawmakers, reflect our stance in working for the Kingdom of God where everyone is welcome, where all have enough.

I urge you to join me, not only in prayer for the trouble spots in the world, but also in action – be it in giving, writing, calling or ??

Does a Walmart win suggest how our democracy will be controlled in the future, or simply a one-time event to correct a mistake? Is the Walmarting of America creating a poorer society or is it a blessing for the poor that provides products at affordable prices?

Come and join a wide-ranging discussion about the proposed initiative and the potential consequences of this innovative approach by Walmart to not only get their expansion but to avoid following local laws.

Real chicken eggs are decorated using a wax-resist (batik) method, producing pretty amazing results. Pastor Shirley will bring all the necessary supplies. Children under the age of 10 may attend but must be supervised by a parent or other designated adult since the process uses candle flames to melt the wax.
