Grant Received for Parsonage Repairs

In September, the Administrative Council applied for and received a \$5,000.00 grant to help with parsonage repairs. Below is the report submitted to the Northern San Jose District Church Extension Society explaining the purpose of the repairs and our need. We are very greatful to the NSJCES and to Gwen Freeman for all their help.

Sunnyhills UMC owns a parsonage built about 55 years ago. It is a small, 3-bedroom house near the church. Currently, for perhaps 20 years, our pastors have preferred to live in their own housing, and we have leased out the parsonage, using the income to fund our Pastor's Housing Allowance.

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Parsonage Repairs

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The parsonage is an older tract home (not fancy) in an older neighborhood, and we take pride in offering reasonable housing at a reasonable rate. Our current tenants have been with us for many years and take excellent care of the interior, maintain the yard (albeit in drought conditions), and cope with most of the small annoyances such as leaking faucets or sticking doors.

As landlords, however, the church is responsible for the maintenance of the building itself. Over the years, the shifting ground in our area has stressed the house, and doors and windows are no longer true, pipes have cracked, etc.. Last year, among other tasks, we funded repairs on sewer pipes from the house, under the driveway, and out to the street. One of our church members had the necessary skills to work on and oversee this project, which helped hold costs down. This year we are repairing two smaller windows with cracked panes in the bedrooms and completely replacing two large "picture" windows in the living room and dining area. We are also facing critical repair of cracked and broken stucco near the ground in several areas at the very least.

In the past, we have set aside 10% of parsonage rents to fund repairs and property taxes. This year, beginning in July, we increased the rent and also agreed to set aside 15% of the rental income for these purposes. However, right at this moment, we do not have funds available to cover the necessary work (bedroom windows, picture windows, stucco), and the large windows absolutely must be replaced before the winter. They are divided into multiple panes, the wooden frames holding the panes have rotted away, and the windows are no longer either weather proof or safe. (Please see enclosed pictures.) Worse yet, they cannot simply be replaced with modern windows of the same size. The framing around the windows is so badly distorted that they will have to be removed, new, smaller window frames built into the space, and then new, though smaller, windows installed. Then, of course, the empty space of the old hole will need exterior stucco, interior sheetrock, paint, etc., to match what is already there.
